This project is made possible by the amazing work of Tharaka-Nithi's women artisans who crocheted the Baskets of Hope, and our volunteers who helped promote and sell these handcrafted goods in Europe and the U.S.

Thanks to you all, we have been able to meet this critical need in Tharaka-Nithi, and this positive development will make an impact on generations to come. We can only hope that soon enough we will also build a school for those villages.

None of what we are doing would be possible without your support. Thank you for being a vital part of Action2Day!

On Women's Empowerment

“*St. Nina Children's Home & Mission Center* was established three years ago and is situated in Tharaka-Nithi County, 22 km from the town of Marimanti. Action2Day has been instrumental to the growth of the mission center through its service to women, youth, and children at the mission.

Last year, Action2Day initiated three projects to support women in Tharaka-Nithi:

- Raised the living standard of vulnerable women by purchasing more than 1,000 handmade baskets/bags from them.
- Established a goat keeping project for St. Nina women with an initial donation of 30 goats.
- Funded a beekeeping project with 30 hives as its starting point.

Action2Day NGO has been a lifeline support to children at St. Nina. In the last year alone, more than 150 children received school supplies (books, pens, pencils, crayons) and food hampers.

St. Nina Mission Center is located in an area prone to drought. This results in people lacking enough food to put on the table. Thank God, Action2Day brought food supplies to more than 50 women of our community.

The food staples include rice, cooking oil and other assorted items like biscuits. Women and young teen girls also received sanitary pads.

Action2Day has continued to demonstrate love by transforming the lives of women and children at St. Nina.

Today's Child, Tomorrow's World



In 2022, Action2Day became an agent of change in our community by supporting the young generation through the program. Action2day gave funds to Today's Child, Tomorrow's World to organize a two-day workshop for primary and secondary school students.



Today's Child, Tomorrow's World (TCTW) is a mentorship program initiated at St. Clement Primary School under the Greek Orthodox Church of Kenya.

The program started in 2014 with the aim of mentoring children between the ages of 13- 20 years old. It offers psychosocial support to the young generation by equipping them with life skills, and offers individual and group psychological counseling during school holidays.

I would like to express our sincere gratitude to Action2Day for their support. The money was used in facilitating and feeding the students for the two days' training. More than 100 students attended the workshop. We appreciate all those who supported the program through Action2Day.
